Synopsis: The Youth Activities League Bike Program is designed as a hands-on course of instruction in rebuilding and repairing donated or confiscated bicycles. The refurbished bicycles will be donated to children in our annual Christmas giveaway, station open house, Youth Activities League, Camp COURAGE as well as the various other community events sponsored by the station.

The Industry Sheriff's Youth Activities League currently funds the Bike Program. The La Puente Valley Regional Occupational Program Provides an instructor, at \$20.00 an hour, who is certified in bicycle repair.

The bike shop program was started to provide high school students with a vocational program in which they would receive training in bicycle repair and maintenance. When they complete the course, the student will receive a certificate of completion for the course, which will enable them to work in the bicycle industry.

Students receive approximately 4-6 hours of instruction a week for a period of one year. After completing the course the student will, in turn, mentor and help train other students.

We anticipate refurbishing 200–250 bicycles a year. The students work on the bikes in "The Bike Shop," a fully equipped workshop located at the Industry Station Community Service Center.

Students must be high school students and maintain a "C" grade point average in their classes to enroll in the program. Upon completion of the program, the students are allowed to rebuild a bike for themselves.

Synopsis: Camp C.O.U.R.A.G.E., Community Opposition and United Resistance Against Gang Evils, is a four-day trip to our local mountains. The camp was started as a community based anti-gang program for seventh and eighth grade students currently enrolled in junior high school in the Rowland, Hacienda-La Puente, and Bassett Unified School Districts.

The focus of the camp is to promote teamwork and to have the students experience nature and gain a new perspective on living in the outdoors. Camp activities include fishing, hiking, swimming, crafts and canoeing. The camp, including food, lodging and transportation, is provided at no cost to the students.

The local school district and Y.A.L. deputies select students for the program. At camp, students already involved in gangs or those leaning towards gang involvement, are mixed with other students their own age that are not involved in gangs and shown that it is all right to "just be a kid." They have the opportunity to interact closely with deputy sheriffs and school counselors away from their jobs. Everyone gets the opportunity to see each other in a new light.

Synopsis: The Law Enforcement Explorer Program recruits students between the ages of 14 and 21 who have an interest in law enforcement. As a Law Enforcement Explorer you can learn about law enforcement and assist deputies with various assignments such as performing non-hazardous duties including: search missions, crowd assistance, station support, crime prevention, Academy training, report writing, public fingerprinting, patrol ride-along, bicycle licensing, etc., just to name a few.

The Explorer also goes on outings and tours; they compete against other Explorer posts in a number of law enforcement situations (scenarios). They experience camping trips, boating, river rafting, the beach and many other adventures.

Synopsis: What Is Fencing?

The sport of fencing is fast and athletic, a far cry from the choreographed bouts you see on film or on the stage. Instead of swinging from a chandelier or leaping from balconies, you will see two fencers performing an intense dance on a six-foot-by-forty-foot strip. The movement is so fast the touches are scored electrically - more like Star Wars than Errol Flynn.

The Weapons:

Foil, épée and sabre are the three weapons used in the sport of fencing. While it is not unusual for fencers to compete in all three events, they generally choose to develop their skills in one weapon. Until recently, women were permitted to compete only in foil, but now the USFA & FIE offer national competitions for women in épée and sabre. Women's épée was added to the World Championships in 1989 and was held for the first time at the Olympic Games in 1996.

Foil and épée are point-thrusting weapons. Sabre is a point-thrusting as well as a cutting weapon. The target areas differ for the three weapons, though all three are scored electrically.

Synopsis: The Industry Sheriff's Station Youth Activities League (YAL) began in 1991. The concept and goal of the YAL is to be proactive in dealing with the youth of the community. The Sheriff's Department provides leadership and mentoring for the youth in these programs where they learn to make life-enhancing decisions free of drugs and gangs. The program recognizes the importance of early intervention and the need to provide alternative activities to prevent negative behavior. The YAL strengthens the relationship between the deputies and the volunteers as they work together to benefit our youth. The YAL is a positive influence on thousands of children. It has united the community through the involvement of law enforcement, parents, businesses, education, government and community service groups. All programs provided by the YAL are free to the children.

The YAL offers after-school programs to over 3000 children per year, which gives them a wide variety of opportunities. Sport programs are offered through public parks, community businesses and dedicated Sheriff's locations. Sports such as flag football, baseball, basketball, tennis, golf and fencing are available, as well as Soapbox Derby racing, (KENDO) martial arts, (SHARK) Scuba diving, swimming and Camp COURAGE (summer camp). On the education end the YAL offers, BIKE Program, VIDA Program, Explorers and the (LEA) Law Enforcement Academy for middle and high school students.

Synopsis: The Law Enforcement Academy (LEA) program held at La Puente High School is dedicated to equip highly motivated students to enter the law enforcement profession or other related fields. This is a 4-year high school program with academic training in computer science, criminal justice, forensic science, English, math and community service along with a rigorous physical fitness program. This program has a computer lab, weight room and an obstacle course, which prepares the participants to encounter and overcome the challenges of life.

To enhance their education, they participate in field trips to: L.A. County Courts, Sheriff's Academy and the Museum of Tolerance. They also are involved in a week-long leadership course, horse camp and other activities involving the SMART Program and the YAL.

The program joins with parents and the community to help ensure a brighter future for its participants. This is truly a team effort, but the students are the key. The LEA staff is committed to helping students in anyway possible, but they will not carry them, they must learn to walk and stand on their own.

Synopsis: We provide an escape from the harsh realities of crime and gangs with our S.H.A.R.K. Program. S.H.A.R.K. (Sheriff's High Adventure for Responsible Kids) is a unique program that introduces young men and women to the undersea world of SCUBA Diving.

Young people (between the ages of 14-17) are given 3 hours of classroom and 9 hours of pool instruction in the use of SCUBA. The teenagers, after completing the training, are taken out to Catalina Island where they actually make an ocean dive on SCUBA with deputies.

Our PADI dive instructor (Chris Denny) donates two diving scholarships to one boy and one girl who are serious about becoming a Certified diver.

The close one-on-one interaction with a Deputy Sheriff allows for the participants to become acquainted with the human behind the badge. The participant sees that there is a better world out there, one beyond gangs and crime.

Synopsis: The Soapbox Derby is a youth racing program which is sponsored by the Youth Activities League. The World Championship finals are held each August at Derby Downs in Akron, Ohio. The Industry Soapbox Program has sent a car and driver to the championships every year except in 2004.

Each year, with the exception of during World War II, youngsters from throughout the United States and several foreign countries have come to Akron with the racers they have built and driven to victory in their home communities.

We build two to six cars a year in our own shop:

- 1) A stockcar, which is designed to give the first-time builder, a learning experience. Boys and girls, 9 through 16, compete in simplified cars built from kits purchased from the All-American. These kits assist the Derby novice by providing a step-by-step layout for construction of a basic lean-forward style car.
- 2) A super stockcar, which gives the competitor an opportunity to expand their knowledge and build a more advanced model. Both of these beginner levels make use of kits and shells available from the All-American. These entry levels of racing are popular in race communities across the country, as youngsters are exposed to the Derby program for the first time.

The goals of the Soapbox Derby program are to teach youngsters some of the basic skills of workmanship, the spirit of competition and the perseverance to continue a project once it has begun.
