Graffiti is removed using paint, sand and water blasting, and chemicals. Graffiti may be reported to the 24-hour graffiti hotline at (562) 929-5555. When reporting graffiti, it is helpful in expediting removal if the following detailed information is provided: Specific location (i.e., address, corner, major cross streets, etc.), type (i.e., marker, paint, etc.), and surface where graffiti is located (i.e., block wall, painted curb or fence, sign, etc.).
